History of St. Paul's Board of Christian Ed.

The Board of Christian Education (BOCE) has been overseeing educational opportunities at St. Paul's for many years. In the beginning it was simply called the Sunday School Board. Currently Sunday School, adult education, confirmation, and VBS are all included under the BOCE.

The goals of the BOCE are for all ages to see themselves as children of God, grow in Bible knowledge, and find God's meaning, purpose and love in their lives. The BOCE also works to keep learning fun, interesting and relevant.

Sunday School has changed many times over the years, from meeting in the "parlor" of the old church, to all classes meeting in the current Fellowship Hall which was divided by curtains (very noisy), to classes meeting in the education wing named in honor of the **Rev. William Bloesch** in 1969.

The BOCE is always welcoming new members to the board. If you would have an interest in serving on this mission, please call the church office.

Fun Facts

St Paul's Sunday School Over the Years

According to a handwritten ledger dated 1932-1938 the board met in the "parlor" of the original church. The treasurer's report showed a monthly balance of anywhere from \$7.21 to \$28.59.

Children's Day was celebrated at St Paul's on Father's Day in June of 1935

In 1938 the Sunday School Board contributed \$5.00 to the painting of the church parlor. Some months they paid the lighting bill.

In the 30's the Sunday School Christmas Program was on Christmas Eve.

In 1949 \$200.00 was given to the Sunday School Board by a church in Indianapolis. The money was to be used to buy a projector and films.

1969 was the groundbreaking year for the new education wing on the Woodstock Street church.

In September 1980, Sunday School started with a balloon launch called "Lift Off Sunday". Each student received a helium balloon with a bible message attached telling of God's love. They hoped to receive a message back telling who found their balloon and where.

Eight students were confirmed that year.

An adult Bible Study was offered on Wednesday mornings.

In 1982 the 5th annual Kite Fly was celebrated by the Sunday School students. According to newspaper articles there were at least 19 of these annual events.

In 1995 Rally Day included a dunk tank and a moon walk.

May 11, 1997 God's Kids music group at St Paul's presented a cantata. Also, that year 50 children and youth attended VBS. It was titled Wild Frontier.

St. Paul's *hers* and *his-*stories— Part 1 The Henneman Family

As part of our 125-year anniversary celebration our focus is on families in the church with strong generational ties to St. Paul's United Church of Christ in Crystal Lake, IL.


For some being part of a church means you are part of a family, and for others being part of a family means you are part of a church.

In 1959 **Jim Henneman** and his bride **Ruth**, along with their three young children moved from the two flat home they shared with Jim's parents **Walter** and **Bertha** in Chicago II.

In part, **Jim and Ruth** made the decision to move to Crystal Lake II, for the schools. At the same time **Walter** and **Bertha** took up residence in Florida.

Since **Jim** and **Ruth** had belonged to an Evangelical and Reformed church in Chicago, they sought out the same once they moved to Crystal Lake. They soon visited St. Paul's Evangelical and Reformed Church located on Sherman and Ellsworth Streets.

However, it wasn't long before they felt left out in cold by this church. It turns out during one visit their youngest son **Jack** began fussing during the service, and Mom (**Ruth**) sought to comfort him by leaving the service to care for him. Unfortunately, that meant being put out in the cold. Literally. You see the original Church on Ellsworth Street had no place to bring a crying child. There was no narthex separate from the sanctuary and in order to leave the service with a fussing child, **Ruth** had to step outside the building. Since it was the middle of January, **Ruth and Jim Sr**. agreed, this would not be acceptable for this young family.


After that experience they searched for another church, but they never felt that welcome home feeling.

After the new St. Paul's was built in 1960 on Woodstock Street and there would be a place to bring a fussing baby while still inside the church, **Jim Sr. and Ruth** tried again and as **Ruth** remembered fondly, "We had found our church home and continued to be active members."

Jim Sr. served on the church council, and also served as council president. He was a long-time member of the choir and many other committees. **Ruth** taught Sunday school, was a member of Mary Circle and served on that board and as president.




Jim Sr. and Ruth's children were all confirmed at St. Paul's. Diane in 1964, Jim Jr. in 1968 and **Jack** in 1970.

In 1976 Diane married John and they had two children who also were confirmed at St. Paul's. Diane was asked by Rev. Gene Lackore if she would lead an adult bell choir in the early eighties and so she did. During her time as bell choir director, the church through donations from members purchased new bells. 

On one occasion when my class was walking down the aisle up to the front of the church, my Dad saw I was upset so grabbed me as I was walking by and I watched my class do their part as I sat in the pew! Oh, how times have changed.

After graduation from college, I moved to Arlington Heights but attended most Sundays because of my connection to the music programs. Music has been a big part of my St. Paul's experience in that I have rung bells for about 30+ years and played in the brass group for about the same time.

Calling EVERYONE – Light Painting Assistance Needed!

Saturday, August 29th. Mark that date on your calendar!

Perhaps you have seen the exterior windows at the rear and east side of the church? Terribly chipped and peeling paint believed to last be painted during the Lincoln presidency – maybe!

Well time has come to get all these windows repainted to preserve our church structure. The good news is that ALL the chipped and peeling paint have been blasted off by way of power washing. In addition, they have all been power sanded!

That just leaves the painting and ANYONE can paint! There are 8 "banks" or sections of windows. We need 16 people (ideal for couples or teams of 2) to sign up for just ONE section to paint. That's it!

The painting will require a primer coat (due to bare wood in many places) and then the established green paint overcoat. All paint will be provided to painters.

We are designating Saturday, August 29th, as the main day to get this done... On the 29th, we will be painting from 8:30 a.m. to 10:30 a.m. and also 1:30 p.m. to 3:30 p.m. (the afternoon provides shade of the building to most of the sections. HOWEVER..... if you CAN'T make this date, YOU can pick the date and time most convenient for you to paint your section! Time required....only about 2 hours!! Easy peazy!

This is your way to contribute to the continuing beauty of our church. We need YOU....especially if you have NOT helped out before or for a long time. Socially distancing will be practiced and if you would rather, we do have sections that just require ONE individual and are not close to anyone else's work.

So.....no excuses or reasons not to sign up for a section! Let's git er done!


