Words From Wang – The Earth is the Lord's...

The creation story in Genesis provides us with a simple metaphor of how things came to be "in the beginning." It illustrates how God fashioned the heavens and the earth, the birds of the air, the four legged and two legged that walk the earth, those who inhabit the waters, the lilies of the field, and the trees that *clap their hands*. The God who saw to it that all creation was blessed is the same God that expects those created in God's image (that's us) to tend it and to till it. In addition to the Genesis story, the Psalmist eloquently penned inspiring words in Psalm 24:

The earth is the Lord's and all that is in it, the world, and those who live in it; for he has founded it on the seas, and established it on the rivers.

And when the Creator made human kind, it became very clear that to "have dominion" (Genesis reference) meant to nurture and protect all that God has given for the benefit of all creation; the circle of life, the balance of nature, as it were. And history has proven that the best way for us to honor the Creator is, while we naturally draw from the land, the air, and the sea, that we consider <u>only what is needed to sustain</u> <u>life</u>. And our faithful response is to return thanks and to demonstrate a strong commitment to our custodianship of all things natural. This is our creed as inhabitants of the earth and must be practiced at every level; mentally, physically, and spiritually. The Psalmist/worship leader continues in the next verse with a question:

Who shall ascend the hill of the Lord? And who shall stand in his holy place? And the people answer, Those who have clean hands and pure hearts, who do not lift up their souls to what is false, and do not swear deceitfully.

One exception to the "clean hands" metaphor is the fact that there are those among us who are willing to get their hands dirty in all the ways that we nurture and tend God's Garden, including those who literally love the feel and aroma of "dirt" on their hands (a.k.a. the green thumbed). Those same "tenders" do not really consider it "dirt" but rather, life-giving humus; that it literally possesses the decomposed past that when recycled and repurposed, literally produce new life.

I could not be happier that recent conversations during our "Let's Talk Church" meetings have generated some newfound energy around the topic of Creation Care (see article). And anyone who does not attend church on "Earth Day Sunday" (April 21st) will miss our unofficial launch as we seek to be more intentional in educating and promoting the integrity of creation. Our planet needs our help so we trust that many of you will step up in supporting our work in this very important ministry at stewards of God's earth.

May the growing power of this new season of rebirth only enrich and bless what we are called to do in tending and tilling the miracle of God's creation - and as we celebrate the cycles and seasons of life.

An informal group got excited about ways St. Paul's can participate. We hope to bring facts, ways to participate and ideas about being good stewards of our planet to our church community through Beacon articles. With the springboard of Earth Day we are offering a small packet of seeds for you to plant. Planting flowers or plants that attract pollinators is an easy and fun way to help our earth.

Different flower types attract different kinds of pollinators. Echinacea, Ox-Eye Daisy, Black-Eyed Susan, and Coreopsis flowers are super easy to grow, make excellent cut flowers, and entice all sorts of pollinators to come by for a snack or a rest on those large flower heads. Don't forget to provide water for the pollinators. A small rock in your bird bath or saucer gives them a safe place to rest while drinking!

Do you want to help restock firewood for Pilgrim Park?


You can come just for Saturday or come stay Friday night and enjoy a delicious breakfast prior to the start of the work day. All free of charge for your generous gift of labor.




Mother's Day Appreciation
