"Resolutions, Visions, and Missions Possible"

Some people make *resolutions* for the new year. A resolution is a firm decision to do or not to do something. I commend those people who make a new year's resolution and who actually follow through on them. But the outcome or take-away from most resolutions is, more often than not, to fall back on "business as usual." Or like the old adage, to keep doing the same thing over and over again but expecting different results.

Some people create *visions* for themselves, their businesses, or institutions. A vision is the ability to think about or plan the future with imagination or wisdom. To have a vision is crucial to any organization or community otherwise we soon find we lack the motivation to sustain or maintain our basic operations. A vision, however, usually move things further along than simply having the "resolve" to accomplish something.

While, some people establish *missions*. A mission is a strongly felt aim, ambition, or calling. To have or be on a mission (emphasis on strongly felt) is to, as in the opening words of the Star Trek TV series, boldly go where we have never gone before. Once adopted, a mission gives an organization, not only a goal to work for, but an achievable dream to believe in and commit to for the long haul.

All three of these terms are part of the many conversations that I hope to be having with the key leaders, movers, and shakers of St. Paul's Church in the coming months. Because, we can't just keep talking the talk together and saying "we just need more members and all of our problems will be solved."

This is a crucial year for us as we boldly move forward with a new vision. But I remind you that the above definition is about planning the future *with imagination and wisdom*. This would be a worthy endeavor and could gain some footing in the coming year but will it sustain us?

We could consider developing a new mission. The unique thing about a mission is that it requires some serious reflection on our core values as a religious institution. When developing a mission, an organization has to ask the hard questions like "why do we exist?" "What is our role and purpose in the community?" "Would we be missed if we ceased to exist?" The other thing about a mission, it implies the need for a certain amount of dismantling to happen in order for us to rebuild and become something very new and 'relevant.' We could call it a mission makeover.

These are all noble pursuits and the time is ripe for us to reflect on the big questions for "the church." And to prayerfully ask, what is the new thing God is trying to do here? And what are the implications for St. Paul's United Church of Christ? And anyone who has spent a minute or two with me has heard me offer two key words: <u>commitment and innovation</u>; a strong commitment to God's church combined with the willingness to think outside the box as entrepreneurs for Christ, and to, all the while, get curious.

Crystal Lake Food Pantry Update

Just a bit of history for you, new information for some, and a reminder for those of you who were there from the beginning.

The Pantry was started in 1983 by 17 area churches and celebrated its 40th anniversary of operation serving our community neighbors in need this past September. From a small startup, it has grown into a trusted and respected part of our community. It is a ministry that has been fully supported by our congregation throughout the entire 40 years.

The past year has seen a **50% increase** in the number of neighbors needing food assistance. The Pantry has distributed **over 1.2 million pounds of food** in 2023! All of this growth and need has increased the need for the number of volunteers required to operate the pantry.

St. Paul's has a dedicated group of volunteers, but we need additional help. We especially need someone who would be willing to act with me as a co-team leader. We provide Pantry coverage for 14 service days a year and I cannot always be available.

Our service day is always Friday **and we do need more people to assist** any part of our shift which is 8-2:30. There are a variety of tasks and we can accommodate any limitations you may have.

Without additional people stepping up to assist us, we may have come to the point that we may not be able to meet our obligation to the pantry and may have to withdraw St Paul's as a Pantry support organization. This is something we would definitely like to avoid.

Please consider helping out — it is a great way to "give back" to our community and is easy! Our service days this year are as follows so mark your calendars and consider joining us so "That no one goes hungry".
