Dear Friends,

St. Paul's has reopened its doors and resumed worshipping in person just like in "the olden days." However, it doesn't feel like the "olden days." It feels like things have changed - and in some significant ways. I wasn't sure what to expect when we resumed worshipping in person. I didn't think things would go back to the way they were. I figured that we would experience a liminal period - and "in between time" - a time of readjusting, sorting out, adapting. And it seems to me that is what we are in now.

Someone has likened liminal periods to being in a waiting room - like at the doctor's office or the airport. You've left one place but haven't yet arrived where you want to really go. That's how it feels to me. It seems like we have left one place but we have yet to arrive at our final destination. Somewhat like the ancient Israelites wandering in the desert - wandering between their old life of slavery in Egypt and their new life of freedom in the Promised Land. Wow, as I recall the story says that was forty years! Forty years of wandering? I'm sure some of us are not waiting forty years! I imagine some of us have jumped back into whatever feels close to "normal" - while others of us are still waiting cautiously to see what will happen next. Others may have left and moved on while, at the same time, some new faces have appeared.

Once more God offers us the option of choosing to trust and follow Him. Liminal periods can underscore just how out of control life can be. After all, who regularly chooses to wait in the "in between places?" But we can choose to trust that God will provide for us in the liminal places - as the scriptures tell us God provided for Israel in the desert. God is with us today.

July Beacon Council News

Dear Church Family,

As I write this, I am reflecting that we have just passed



the one-month marker of having entered Phase 5 and reopened St. Paul's for in-person worship and activities without restrictions. Things seem to be going smoothly and it is wonderful to see one another and exchange greetings with unmasked smiles. It is helpful to be mindful, however, that we are in a transition period as we emerge from the many losses the pandemic has heaped upon us and attempt to rebuild our Church community. This period presents its challenges, but behind every challenge lies an opportunity, so I'd like to focus this month's Council News on some of the opportunities before us and invite your participation.

First, some background and review. Even before the pandemic, members of our Church community recognized the need to make some adjustments to our accustomed way of doing things. In early 2019, St. Paul's applied for participation in the TPIRC (Thriving Pastors in Revitalized Congregations) Ministry Program, which was an outgrowth of the Illinois UCC Conference's mission to equip pastors and lay people in the 241 churches in its Conference to grow as Christ's disciples and serve the pressing needs of the world around us. TPIRC is a five-year initiative funded by the Lilly Endowment that was made available, through an application program, to 45 pastors and lay persons within the Illinois UCC Conference. St. Paul's was accepted into the TPIRC Ministry Program and our TPIRC team has been hard at work since then developing numerous ideas and programs to revitalize our Church.

One of the needs TPIRC (and the Council at the time) had identified was to hire a youth leader and a program director on a part-time basis. However, the lack of available funds at the time prevented St. Paul's from turning this need into a reality. Fast forward to 2021 and one of the challenges presented by the pandemic crystalized into an opportunity for St. Paul's in the form of a Paycheck Protection Program loan that qualified for payment forgiveness (which means it doesn't have to repaid). As I have previously mentioned, the Council applied for and received these funds on behalf of St. Paul's and approved using a portion of these proceeds to fund, along with other available resources, these two positions. These positions have the potential to revitalize St. Paul's faith formation process and develop programs to benefit both St. Paul's and the larger community of which it is a part. The Council is actively recruiting for these positions and praying that God sends us the right individuals to make this identified need a reality. Please join us in prayerful thanksgiving to God for making this opportunity available to us and asking that He answer our prayers for assistance in our efforts to revitalize St. Paul's and enable us to fulfill our vision.

Dear Community Partner,

The McHenry County Mental Health Board (MCMHB) needs your MCHELP!

Funded in part through an anonymous donor supporting the Community Foundation for McHenry County (CFMC), the MCHELP Mobile App launched in October of 2016. Since launching MCHELP, the CFMC and the MCMHB partnered

launching MCHELP, the CFMC and the MCMHB partnered to market MCHELP as a primary tool and resource assisting McHenry County residents in meeting mental health needs. MCMHB is now taking the lead in promoting awareness of this valuable resource.

MCHELP allows for anonymous texting with immediate response from a licensed professional, direct connection to the McHenry County Crisis Line, and a link to the MCMHB's Local Service Directory.

As the combined stressors, the global nature of the pandemic, the isolation and social distancing, unemployment, and various other COVID-19 related issues are taking their toll, now more than ever we must emphasize the importance of our mental health. While MCHELP was originally intended for teens in crisis situations, one does not need to be in crisis or a teenager to use the service. The MCMHB encourages the use of MCHELP for anyone with concerns about a friend or loved one who needs support in getting them help.

Anyone can get quick access to critical and vital McHenry County support by downloading the MCHELP app via Google Play or Apple's iTunes.

Included is a flash drive with promotional materials to help spread the word about MCHELP in any of the following ways:

- Highlight MCHELP on electronic billboards
- Feature MCHELP in Newsletters and Communications
- Display and Distribute the MCHELP Flyer or Poster
- Host and Encourage Download Days/Events

We all play a part in reducing mental health stigma and fostering a recovery-ready community.





Appreciation, Beauty, Community

"After a disquieting trip to Palestine in 2014, which was immediately followed by the Second Intifada in Israel, she was blown off her life's course. In turmoil she read extensively looking for a refuge from the shock of her encounters. Rumi, Wendell Berry, Richard Rohr, Mary Oliver, Thomas Merton, the liberation theologians, and mystics lifted their lights for her. Better Than Right is one woman's steps toward meaning. Definitely not a superhighway, her story is full of twists and turns, denoting her reflections and journey to make sense of life. She walks gingerly on a path that feels like a bewildered child caught in the crossfire of a bitter divorce. Her literary camera has both wide angle and close-up lenses to catch the sweeps and the detail of her journey on the third planet from the sun. Better Than Right invites you to see if her description resonates with your experience. Better still, does her light offer solace and hope for your next mile?

ELAINE EACHUS is a student of life. Currently her classroom is the South Florida COVID-19 environment which has shrunk her access to the physical world. Searching for "something more" she seeks clues to a more generous landscape, greater appreciation of the moment, the gift of others, and being an active participant in an ever-expanding universe. A wife, mother, grandmother, Eachus has been a public school teacher, librarian, director of gifted education, pastor, and interim minister. She reflects on life while puttering in the garden which gives her a canvas on which to practice the art of living in these times.
