- 5. How have the past thirteen months changed us? As we plan for the future are there activities and patterns we used to engage in we will choose to set aside? If so, which things will we leave behind? Which things will we resume and which things will we do in a new way, remembering that God is the same yesterday, today and forever and that nothing can separate us from the love of God in Jesus Christ.

Dear Church Family,

As we turn the calendar page to June, I am struck by a single word that seems to describe what is happening all around us. That word is *open*. Flowers are beginning to open their spring buds and transform into beautiful flowers. Pools and beaches are beginning to open. Events and celebrations that were canceled last year at this time are once again scheduled to open or take place. And, last, but far from least, our Church is now open for in-person services. All of these things, however, take some time and nurturing to reach their full vitality. Buds may need a boost of fertilizer to be coaxed into blooming. Pools may be murky when first opened and require some sanitizing, cleaning, and warmer weather before they can be safe and fun to swim in. And events and celebrations may require some extra time and preparation before they can take place. Our Church is no different. As members gradually return to in-person worship and anxiously await the loosening of Covid-related restrictions, we would do well to remember that like flowers, pools, and scheduled events and celebrations, opening our church and reaching our full vitality will take some time and careful nurturing.

Your Church Council, the Emergency Management Committee, and the Worship Committee have all met this past month to discuss and plan how best to continue the process of reopening our Church and revitalizing our activities. TPIRC (Thriving Pastors in Revitalizing Congregations) has also been hard at work thinking of ways to breathe new life into our Church community. We continue to actively recruit for a Youth Leader and a Preschool Director. All of these things require time and care to produce successful results. Please be assured that we are all hard at work doing just that.

As we anxiously await the anticipated announcement in the near future by Governor Pritzker of Illinois' entrance into Phase 5 of Restore Illinois, none of us knows yet what restrictions, if any, will remain. We are also mindful that what may be permissible for commercial enterprises, may not directly translate to what is appropriate for a church community comprised of members who love and care for one another. The EMC is scheduled to meet again following the Governor's announcement to determine what that will mean for our Church, and the Council is prepared to act promptly in considering whatever recommendations the EMC may make. We are hopeful it will mean greater flexibility in terms of how we conduct our in-person worship. In the meantime, we ask for your continued patience and perseverance while we work to enable our Church, like a well-tended garden nurtured with tender loving care, to bring forth new and plentiful bounty. May we *open* with God's grace and be guided by His love for us and our love for one another.

DIRECTOR POSTION

We are EXCITED to announce that St. Paul's is seeking to add the paid position of a **Christian Youth Director** to our church staff. Responsibilities will be to create and lead our Sunday children's service, along with the help of our Sunday school teachers and BOCE. This position will also lead our youth group (grades 6-12), their Sunday school program, and youth activities.

This position is a paid part-time (5-6 hours/week) role and will report to our Board of Christian Education along with input from Pastor Greg. If you know of anyone with a strong Christian background, able to relate well to children/youth, and possessing energy and enthusiasm for this type of opportunity, please have them send a letter or resume to: TPIRC485@gmail.com for consideration.

History of the Columbarium & Walk of Remembrance

As some of you may or may not know, in 2006 George Kramer approached the church council with an idea that many had not heard of before or had very little knowledge of. A Columbarium, a structure, George shared, that was built for placing the cremains of the congregation of St. Paul's. The council asked him to do further research on the project and so began three months of George convincing the members of the council that he could show enough support from the congregation and that it would be completely funded before construction could begin.

By December of 2006, George formed the original committee consisting of Sondra Matterness, Brian Zickus, Jan-Lloyd Gohl, Mark Fueger, Ginny Duerling, and Pastor Greg Lucas. This committee developed a proposal and were asking for the congregation's approval at the January 2007 annual meeting. This proposal showed the completed project cost would be \$30,000. This would include an 8-foot columbarium structure that would include 52 companion niches, a 10' x 15' meditation area, and 5-foot-wide memorial walk (3 feet would be cement, the remaining 2 feet would be the 1-foot memorial pavers on each side.) It would lead from the front door of the church to the shrubbery for privacy. The location would be in front of the stained-glass window. The funding for the project would consist of selling the niches, memorial pavers and donations. He also shared that the project would need to be fully funded in order to proceed. The by-laws, contacts and timetable were presented. The Congregation approved this proposal on January 21, 2007.

In April a naming contest was announced and the winner would receive an engraved paver and would be placed first on the Walk of Remembrance Garden. In June Karen Radovich had won with her entry "St. Paul's Remembrance Garden."

By the end of May 2007, George was pleased to announce that the fundraising was a success, and that the Columbarium would have an expected delivery date of October 1, 2007. By July it was further announced that the committee had exceeded their goal, 19 niches had been purchased along with 55 pavers. The city approved the plan and work would begin.

He thanked the following, Sondra Matterness, Tim McGuire, Karen Hansen, and Linda Ticknor for their work on the landscaping. He gave special thanks to Marilyn Koch for helping creating brochures and overall support, and to Warren Spencer who repaired the lawn from the damage done by the heavy equipment. He thanked Dick Hautzinger for his help with the survey work and working with the city, along with Ryan Tychsen for help with the power point presentation and brochures. He also thanked the general contractor Andy Carey, whom George came to know and love. (Andy passed away a few years after the project was completed and George placed a memorial paver in his memory along the Walk of Remembrance) He also thanked Ron Katenhusen for his masonry work and Garcia Construction. Last but not least, he thanked the members of St. Paul's for their support of this ministry.

George always believed that this was a ministry to all families and friends of St. Paul's in their greatest hour of pain and need. It was not just a final resting place, but the support of an entire family of believers in Christ. As with many great leaders and visionaries, their legacy lives on, and those who remain will be called to action. It is my prayer that we, the members of St. Paul's, continue to support this valuable ministry with our love and friendship to the families and friends of those inurned in the Columbarium. At this moment of this incredible vision, I share with you these facts. Thirty-four (34) niches have been sold, as well as 84 pavers and 18 people have been inurned in the Columbarium. This is a self-sustaining ministry. All surrounding landscaping, upkeep and improvements are made through the Columbarium fund.


