Dear Friends,

As I write these words it seems the whole world's eyes are fixed on the conflict in Ukraine. Perhaps that fixation is related to the human fascination with conflict. Perhaps it is also related to the possibility of escalation and the fear of nuclear war - which is the universal fear of pain and death. Certainly the seemingly limitless availability of news and images contributes to our attention. It is possible to become addicted to negative news. For this reason alone, I think it is wise to know what's going on but, for good mental health, monitor the intake of news. One woman said to me, "I can't help but watch it every day."

The author of the New Testament book of Hebrews wrote, "Let us fix our eyes on Jesus, the author and perfector of our faith." (12:2). I take this encouragement to focus my attention on Jesus more than war. That doesn't mean ignore the war, nor does it mean that Jesus doesn't relate to war. Rather it means to me that all things are "filtered" through him - even war. I see the war through the unending, radical love of God who has already won the ultimate victory over sin and death. I see the war through God's promise of a day when peace will reign and God will be all things to all people. I see the war through God's special concern for the lost and hurting. This is part of what it means to me to "fix my eyes" on Christ.

Please let me or any of our Council members know if you are interested in organizing any events.

As we continue our Lenten journeys, I pray that the signs of renewal and reawakening we have begun to experience will blossom into the fullness of God's glory and that we will continue to be blessed by God and one another.


