When I think of Pastor Greg retiring and, yes, leaving us all to keep "working" at St. Paul's I get a little anxious. I think of all I have learned from him over the 20 years I have known him. I am grieving already. I learned through my husband's illness that there is such a thing as "anticipatory grief". (Anticipating a loss, you know is coming.) While this may seem a little dramatic to say, I understand it to be a real thing. It also makes me question. Why am I here? Not just on this earth, but rather, why am I a member of St. Paul's? Why did I come here?

When I look back on why I came to this place I think of many things. First, I think back to when I was a young mother, and my sister-in-law begged me to help teach Sunday school. And how I simply said no, I wasn't going to do that, or at least I thought I had said no, until one day I realized, I had been teaching various grades of Sunday school for over 20 years. Four children, each confirmed in this place by the same Pastor.

A Pastor who dedicated over 40 years to serving God, by serving us. Us, as in the people whose lives he touched through his preaching, teaching, ministering, and counseling through his gifts of compassion, depth and love. Why? Why did he do it? That is not for me to answer. It only guides me back to my own question. Why? Why am I here? Over many years, I heard my mom say the same thing over and over again. "You don't go to church for the Pastor."

While that may seem shocking, or not true for many of us, I think at this time, that is exactly what we should be reminding ourselves of. I am willing to bet that many of our members who have worshipped here 30, 40 years, or more (or less) may not remember Reverend Marvin Englesdorfer. (I am not positive of the correct spelling, but I do know it is pronounced that way.)

Reverend Englesdorfer was a stout, older man, with black rimmed glasses, a buzz haircut, and a smile that could light up a room. I remember him dedicating almost an entire children's message on how to pronounce his name.

I will remind some, and enlighten others, that he was the interim Pastor of St. Paul's when I became a member in 1990 or 91. While I certainly enjoyed, and perhaps was inspired by his sermons, again I ask, why did I become a member of St. Paul's?

For me the answer to that question may be, in part, that I was a member of a church my entire life. But I think it is much deeper than that. Maybe the best way to answer this question is to answer why am I still a member here and what does it mean? If we look at our constitution when it was first adopted, being a member here requires some things on my part. I am to "be baptized, be confirmed or make a public confession of faith in Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior". I am also expected to "worship regularly, participate in communion, share in the life and work of the church, and contribute to the benevolences of the church," among other things. While I can easily answer the how as it is stated in the constitution, the why is another matter.

I remember during Pastor Greg's first sabbatical working on a "generations" project in which I interviewed members and asked this question. One member told me her husband said they could become members because the ladies made such good cookies. Another told me it was because they had no car and could walk there. Some say because they moved into the area and wanted to be a member of a UCC church, or they grew up here.

While I like cookies too, and I was raised to attend church regularly, at some point in my life my reason changed. I have, on occasion, been so moved by a message or testimony that I have felt such an overwhelming closeness to God it is difficult to describe using simple words. I also know that in this community I have been held up in prayer, prayed for others, given gifts of my time and treasure and received the same many times over. I come because I need it. I come because it provides a place for me to give back to God. I come because I need God's word, love, and hope in my life.

While I know many of us will miss Pastor Greg and his family very deeply, my hope and prayers are that we continue to come here, to this place, to care for and love one another. To love, worship, and serve a God who gives us hope. I pray for us to be hopeful and energetic as we work through the process of finding a seated Pastor. I pray for Pastor Greg, Joyce, Alex and Dimitri as they transition into a new chapter in their lives. I also offer a prayer of thanks for the time we shared together.




