Dear Church Family,

Warm greetings to you all! During my President's Report at our Church Council meeting this past Tuesday, I spoke about the positive momentum we are experiencing on a number of fronts at St. Paul's and the signs of hope and promise it is creating in our revitalization efforts. Pastor Greg expanded on this theme in his remarks and invited us to reflect on what Council has done and can do in the future to maintain this momentum, which he phrased as positive *spiritual momentum*.

I love that phrase and accept the invitation! But what does it mean exactly? To gain a better sense of that I did what I often do when exploring an idea or subject. That's right, I googled it! I started with the word "momentum," which has been described as a powerful experience we have all experienced in one form or another, as energy, driving power, strength, steam, or velocity. Spiritual momentum takes that concept to another level. It has been the subject of a number of sermons by religious leaders of a variety of denominations, each suggesting various ways in which it can be achieved or maintained. At its most fundamental level positive spiritual momentum keeps us moving towards and with God amid our fears and uncertainties, whether on a global level, such as living with the pandemic and in an increasingly violent and divided world, or a more local level, focusing on St. Paul's as we seek to revitalize by relaunching our Preschool, transitioning to a new committee structure, attracting new members, and expanding our community outreach.

As I see it, our revitalization efforts, to be successful, must be motivated and propelled by positive spiritual momentum as we start anew and move forward with God, through the power of the Gospel and the work of the Holy Spirit, with increased velocity. How? By drawing closer to God in prayer and humbly trusting that He will guide us and answer our prayers beyond the limits of our human imaginations and despite our fears and uncertainties. And we have begun to experience just that! Did you ever imagine a year ago that we would have on staff an amazing Youth Director, Program Director, or Preschool Director, much less all three? Or that we would be sharing Fellowship Time after Sunday service and potluck gatherings? Or that our Sunday service attendance would be at the levels we have been seeing recently, with new families joining our church community? Or that we would be on our way to reopening the Preschool, having recently signed up two enrollees for the Fall semester, with the hope of many more to come? To be sure, we still have challenges ahead and much more to be done, but we are on our way, propelled by a positive spiritual momentum that is real and palpable.

So how do we maintain this positive spiritual momentum? One sure way, as I have already suggested, is through our prayers and by humbly asking God to help us accomplish the goals Council has established as a means of serving Him through our St Paul's community. Prayer is an integral focus of our work as Council members, as you can see by the Council Prayers we have recently begun to share with the congregation in our Sunday service bulletin. It is our strength and a driving force as we push on past our fears and uncertainties and our own human limitations and imaginations. We invite you to join us as we all work together to manifest God's great glory.



Because this was such a HUGE success, I will continue to collect snacks again next school year. I may also add a school supply donation as well. More information to come.


